# Supporting a Rights-Based Approach to Growing Food



ADES works closely with the community to grow food in a rural region of El Salvador.

The Association of Economic and Social Development Santa Marta (ADES), a

Mission and Service partner, is located in an area of Central America that is very vulnerable to climate change. This hot, dry region regularly experiences drought. Mining projects have also negatively affected the environment and the people in the region. ADES and other community organizations decided to act to protect the community's right to a healthy environment.

An example of how ADES has responded is a three-year agroecology project co-funded by the Manitoba Council for International Cooperation and The United Church of Canada Foundation, along with Mission and Service. Agroecology benefits the land and water because it recycles nutrients back into the soil. It also reduces production costs, lessening the financial burden on rural farmers.

In this project, ADES works closely with the community to grow food in a rural region of El Salvador, promoting sustainable agriculture that protects biodiversity, maintains the integrity of the land, and upholds rural culture.

At the centre of the project is the Dora Alicia Sorto School Farm, where rural families, mainly led by women, learn about agroecology. The school

provides training, technical expertise, and seeds indigenous to the region. It focuses on preserving the surrounding environment and on upholding gender and human rights as part of its approach to food security.

# The votes have now been counted! Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization HAS PASSED.



The church's National
Indigenous Council, its 16
regional councils, and 80% of
pastoral charges in The
United Church of Canada
participated in the vote on
Remit 1: Establishing an
Autonomous National
Indigenous Organization.

In response, the National

Indigenous Council shares their vision statement with the whole church. They offer words of thanks for all who have brought the church to this moment, and state their commitment to moving forward together on the path of Right Relations.

The Vote: National Indigenous Council and Regional Councils: Yes: 17 No: 0
Pastoral charges: Yes: 1482 No: 93

The voting process engaged many across the church in in-depth and sometimes challenging conversations about right relations with Indigenous Peoples in the church. Throughout this process, it became particularly clear that there is a need for deeper and ongoing work to address the issues of systemic racism which persist in the church despite our commitment to reconciliation. We will re-engage this important work this year.

Meanwhile, there is one final phase in the remit process. The 44th General Council will be asked to enact the remit at its Annual Meeting on October 19, 2024. To "enact" the remit is the final phase of approval for this remit, and is the same process for all Category 3 Remits.

In anticipation of the General Council enacting the remit in October, the National Indigenous Council, the National Indigenous Elders Council, and the

Executive of the General Council will continue to work together to identify and lay out a framework for the autonomous Indigenous organization within the United Church.

Now that the voting results are in, it is time for us to travel together in a new way. May God be with us as we support one another's journeys. Find out more detailed information about the remit result.
